Kaneohe March 12, 1850

Commenced hearing the Claims of Koolaupoko. Mr. Parker was sworn into Office as a Sub-Commissioner to hear the land claims of his District.

Present Benjamin W. Parker, J. Kekaulahao and Wm. L. Lee. (v. 11/1)

11015 Palamaiki (see W.)

Kahilikulani sworn, says I know the land of the claimant. It is in the Ili of Kaeleku, Kaneohe, Oahu.

1st is 4 Lois.

2nd is one Loi and a small Fish pond.

1st is bounded Mauka by Kahuena's land "Piikoiloo", Koolauloa by Kahimahu's land, Makai and Kailua by Kane's land "Mahinui".

2nd is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Waikalua, Kahiole's land, Koolauloa by the Moo of "Kapakahawai", Makai by the Ili of Waikalua, Kekai's land, Kailua by Kauhimahu's land.

The claimant received this land from Halo about 1845 or 1846 and has held it in peace ever since.

Mehekulu sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe and know the testimony of Kahilikulani to be true. (v. 11/1)

2995 Niho

Kaawa sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe, I know the land of Niho. It is in the Ili of Puaewaahakea, Kaneohe. It consists of 12 Lois lying together.

It is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Punahala, Laeloa's land, Koolauloa by the Ili of HKeoli, Hueu's land, Makai by the Kaneohe creek, Kailua by Panioi, Piikoi's land.

The claimant received this land from Aahalelaau in the days of Kinau and his title was not disputed up to his death on the 22nd of February 1850. But John Watson, a foreigner, having bought ½ of the Ili from Govt., claims these Lois. There is part of a Poalima Loi included in these 12 which belongs to Watson. It is on the Mauka side. There are 11 Lois excluding the Poalima. The heirs of Niho are his widow Kaaipaakai, and his brother Kiekie.

Mahelona sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe and know the land of Niho. I have heard the testimony of Kaawa respecting it and it is true. (v. 11/2)

1967 Kahinu

Kekuahane sworn, says I am a son of Kaneohe and know the claimants land. It consists of six Lois in the Ili of Kalaepaa, Kaneohe, and one Loi adjoining these six Lois but in the Ili of Waikapoki, also a House lot partly in Waikapoki and partly in Wailele.

1st piece of 6 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kuaana's Lois, Koolauloa by the Wailele creek, Makai and Kailua by Puupuu's Lois.

2nd piece one Loi is bounded Mauka by Keliiholomaku's Lois, Koolauloa by Kala's land, Makai by the Ili of Wailele, Kailua by Wailele creek.

3rd piece House lot is bounded Mauka by the Kula of Waikapoki, Koolauloa by Kanehoalani's House lot, Makai by the Govt. road, Kailua by the Kula of Wailele, Kauikea's land.

The claimant received these lands from me 14 years since and has possessed them ever since in peace.

Kumuhonua sworn, says I am a son of Kaneohe and know the land of claimant. The testimony of Kekuahane is true. (v. 11/3)

7519 Kekiekie

Kaawa sworn, says I know the land of claimant. It consists of 5 large Lois and 5 small ones in the Ili of PUawaahakea and a House lot adjoining in the Ili of Kapuuahala. It is one piece and is bounded Mauka by the Kula of "Kapuuahala, Laeloa's land, Koolauloa by the Ili of "Hiolo", Makai by creek of Kaneohe, Kailua by Ili of Panioi.

The claimant received this land in the time of Kinau from Nahalelaau and has possessed it in peace up to the time of W. Joh Watson who purchased the Govt. half of Puawaahakea some months since. Only three of the Lois are in the Govt half and disputed.

Mahelona sworn says I am a son of Kaneohe, know the claimants land and fully verify the testimony of Kaawa. (v. 11/4)

7520 Kuaana

Puupuu sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe. I know the land of the claimant. It is the Ili of Kaluaahuawa or the greater part of that Ili. It is partly Kalo and partly Kula land. It is bounded Mauka by Mr. Parker's land "Kapukaiki", Koolauloa by the Ili of Kamohaino, Makai by the Ili of Kalepaa and Mr. Parker's House lot, Kailua by the Ili of Waiape, Halemuku and Kahalekauwila.

The claimant received this land from Liliha and after her death it was confirmed to him by Governor Kekuanaoa in 1840 and he possessed it in peace up to his death on the 5th instant. His heir is his widow Kaneakua. He had no children.

Kaheana sworn says I know the land of Kuaana. It was given to him by Gov. Kekuanaoa in 1840. The gift was confirmed by the King afterwards. He possessed it in peace up to his death on the 5th of this month. His widow is his heir according to his Will now in my possession. (v. 11/5)

2941 Kekalei

Mehekula sworn says I know the lands of the claimant all in Kaneohe.

1st is 6 Lois in the Ili of Opuupao.

2nd is 6 Lois in the Ili of Kepu.

3rd is 2 Lois in the Ili of Puaai.

4th is a House lot and Kula in Punaluu.

1st is bounded Mauka by witness' land "Kaaiulua", Koolauloa and Makai by Kaneohe creek, Kailua by "Kahiwa" a Moo of Lilipuna's (no. 1 is a Moo called "Kapawai").

2nd is bounded Mauka, Koolauloa and Makai by Kaneohe creek, Kailua by Opunui's land.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the Ili of "Keana", Nawai's Lois, Koolauloa by the Ili of "Paele", Makai by the Ili of Waikalua, Kailua by Kahinalua's land.

4th is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Koolauloa by Kula of Punaluu, Makai by Hinaaimalama's lot, Kailua by a stone fence dividing it from the Ili of Waikalua.

The claimant has cultivated this land and planted Pia, pineapples, cocoanuts etc. there for years. The claimant received no. 1 from Kaiakoili in 1836 and he has possessed them in peace ever since. No. 2 he received from Opunui in 1836 and has held them in peace to this day. No. 3 he received from Alapai in 1845 and has always possessed them in peace. No. 4 he received from Kaniau the Konohiki of Punaluu, in 1836, and his title was never disputed until this year. Mr. John Watson and Mr. White bought Punaluu of Paul Manini a few months since and now those foreigners dispute the claimants title.

Kaniau sworn, says I am a son of Kaneohe and know the claimants land. The testimony of Mehekula is correct. I was the Konohiki of Punaluu under Paulo Manini Senior and gave the claimant his House lot in that land, and his title was never disputed until the foreigners Watson and White came and bought Punaluu this year. (v. 11/6-7)

9953 Laeloa

Kekiekike sworn, says I am a son of Kaneohe and know the claimants land. It is in Kaneohe in the Ili of Kapunahala. It is the Ili of Kapunahala entire, comprising Kula and Kalo land. No other person has any title in it. It is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Keahala, Koolauloa by the Ili of Kapukaiki, Makai by the Ili of Puaahakea, Kailua by the Ili of Waikalua.

The claimant received this land from Kawelau in October 1839 and his title has never been disputed.

Kumuhonua sworn, verified the testimony of Kekiekie. (v. 11/8)

2004 B Kumuhonua

Hoonaulu sworn, says I know the lands of the claimant. They are in Kaneohe and consist of the following pieces.

1st is 4 Lois and a piece of Kula in the Ili of Waiape.

2nd is a House lot in the Ili of Punaluu.

1st is bounded Mauka by the Kaneohe creek, Koolauloa and Makai by Peha's Lois, Kailua by Paikane's Lois.

2nd is bounded Mauka by Paikane's, Kapaula's and Pehia's House lots, Koolauloa by the Alanui Aupuni, Makai by the Hao fence, Kailua by Mahelona's House lot.

The claimant received the Kalo land from Peha and the House lot from Manena a Konohiki under old Mr. Manini in 1831 and has possessed it in peace until this day, except that the newcomers Mr. Watson and White who bought the land a few months since, have demanded rent.

Palau sworn, says I am a Kaneohe Kamaaina and know the claimants lands and his title to them and the testimony of Hoonaulu is true.

Kekuku sworn says I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe and know the claimants land. The testimony of Hoonaulu is true from beginning to end. (v. 11/8-9)

1862 Kaluau

Kekiekie sworn, says I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Kaneohe and consist of the following pieces.

1st is 9 Lois, a Moo called Kapuiki in the Ili of Kahalekauwila.

2nd is 2 Lois in the Ili of Keole.

3rd is one Loi in the Ili of Kahalai.

He also has a House lot in Kahuaahuawa, but adjoining no. 1. (The claimant said he had returned no. 2 and 3 to the Konohiki and hence his claim for those was pau. That he now had but one piece, namely the Moo of Kapuiki and his House lot and Kula.)

It is bounded Mauka by Mr. Parker's land Kapukauki, Koolauloa by "Kaluaahuawa, Kuaana's, Makai by the Ili of Halemuku, Kailua by Kaneohe creek.

The claimant received all his land from Naone in 1845 and his title has never been disputed up to this day.

Laeloa sworn, verified the testimony of Kekiekie in full. (v. 11/10)

7171 Kamakahi

Palau sworn, says I am a son of Kaneohe and know the claimants land. It consists of 2 pieces.

1st is 6 Lois in the Ili of Pakui.

2nd is a House lot in the Ili of Waikalua.

1st is bounded Mauka by Napuupuupala's land, Koolauloa and Makai by the Ili of Waikalua, Kailua by the Ili of Keahala.

2nd is bounded Mauka by my House lot in Punaluu, Koolauloa by Kahili's House lot, Maki by Kanealauwahine's House lot, Kailua by Kaneohe creek.

No. 1 he received from Kaaea in 1845 or 1846, and his title to these six Lois is undisputed. No. 2 he received from Kaina in 1844 and has held it without dispute ever since.

Mehekulu sworn, verified the testimony of Palau. (v. 11/11)

7173 Kekuku

Kauhi sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe and know this claimants land. It consists of two pieces.

1st is 6 Lois in the Ili of Hoowaa.

2nd is a House lot and Kula in Waikalua.

1st is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Pawela, Koolauloa by the Ili of Puupao, Makai by my land in Hoowaa, Kailua by 3 Poalima Lois.

2nd is bounded Mauka, Koolauloa and Makai by the Ili of Waikalua, Kailua by the Alanui Aupuni.

The claimant received no. 1 from Kaaukai in 1835 when Liliha was living and his title was never disputed. No. 2 he received from on one. He took it up as a waste spot in 1839 and he has possessed it in peace ever since.

Palau sworn, verified the testimony of Kauhi in full. (v. 11/11-12)

1899 Opunui

Palau sworn, says I know the claimants land. It is in Kaneohe and consists of the following pieces.

1st is 2 Lois in the Ili of Pakui.

2nd is 9 Loi and Kula in the Ili of Kaluapuhi.

3rd is 1 Loko of Kalo called Waiea.

1st is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Puuiki, Koolauloa by the Ili of Waikalua, Makai by Kamahi's creek, Kailua by Napuupuupala's land.

2nd is bounded Mauka by Hueu's Lois in Kaluapuhi, Koolauloa by Poalima Lois, Makai by Paihoihowahe's Lois in Keana, Kailua by the Kula of Kaluapuhi. There is a piece of Kula adjoining these 9 Lois, together they make the Moo of Kumuhulu.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the Kahawai of Waikalua, Koolauloa by Loko of Waikalua, Makai by Poalima Lois, Kailua by Pali of Puuneha.

1st he received from Kaaea in the days of Kinau and his title was never disputed until lately when the claimant refused to go to Poalima and the Konohiki took this piece. The claimant said he would withdraw his claim to 1st. 2nd and 3rd he received from Kahonu in the year 1845 and his possession has never been disputed.

Mehekulu sworn, verified the evidence of Palau. (v. 11/12-13)

10202 Makakea

Mehekulu sworn, says I know the claimants land in Kaneohe.

1st is 2 Lois in the Ili of Puupao.

2nd is 1 Loi in the Ili of Mikiola.

3rd is a small Fish pond and House lot in the Ili of Waikalua.

1st is bounded Mauka by Kauhimahu's land, Koolauloa by "Kahiwa", Lilipuna's land, Makai by Kaulahoa's land Puuiki, Kailua by "Oomiki" a Moo.

2nd is bounded Mauka by "Lauaila" a Moo, Koolauloa by "Kalokoai" an Ili, Makai by "Kamakaawa" a Moo, Kailua by Mahoe's land.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Koolauloa by "Eku" a little valley, Mkaai by Paele's house lot, Kailua by Kaneohe creek.

1st he received from Kaiakoili in the days of Liliha 1834, and his title was never disputed. 2nd he received from Mahoe in 1842 and he has possessed it in peace ever since. 3rd he received from Keaka in the days of Kinau and his title is without dispute and has been ever since.

Palau sworn, verified the testimony of Mehekulu. (v. 11/14)

10213 Maunahina

Mehekulu sworn, says the claimants land is in Kaneohe and consists of the following pieces.

1st is 9 Lois a Moo called Kaelekee in the Ili of Kahuauli.

2nd is a House lot and Kula in the Ili of Kahuauli and adjoining 1st but not in the Moo of Kaelekee.

It is bounded Mauka by Waiau's land, Koolauloa by Kauai's land "Kapahou", Makai by Paele's land "Kalokomoo", Kailua by the Ili of "Kuo".

The claimant received this land from Liliha about 1830 and his title was never disputed.

Palau sworn, says I know the claimants land and verify the testimony of Mehekulu. (v. 11/15)

7174 Kauhi

Kekuku sworn, says I know the claimants land. It is in Kaneohe and consists of the following pieces.

1st is 3 Lois in the Ili of Hoowaa.

2nd is a House lot in Ili of Waikalua.

1st is bounded Mauka by my Lois in Hoowaa, Koolauloa by my Kula in Hoowaa, Makai by "Puuiki" in Hoowaa, Kailua by the Poalima of Hoowaa.

2nd is bounded Mauka, Koolauloa and Makai by the Kula of Waikalua, Kailua by the Alanui Aupuni.

The claimant received 1st from me I the days of Kinau and his title was never disputed. 2nd he received from his father in law, and he had it from the days of Kamehameha 1st.

Palau sworn, verified in full the testimony of Kekuku. (v. 11/16)

7117 7565 Kala

Kumuhonua sworn, says I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Waikapoki", Kaneohe, consisting of the following pieces.

1st is 6 Lois.

2nd is 1 Loi, a House lot and Kula.

1st is bounded Mauka by "Wailele" an Ili, Koolauloa the creek of Wailele, Makai "Palaki" a Loko Ai, Kailua Kaheau's and Kaili's Lois.

2nd is bounded Mauka and Koolauloa by Lipuna an Ili, Makai by the House lot of Kahinu and Kanehoalani, Kailua the Wailele creek.

The claimant received this land from the King in the days of Liliha and has always possessed it in peace. The claimant produced his certificate showing that ½ of Waikapoki was given to him at the recent Division. (v. 11/17)

2628 Paele

Palanaiki sworn, says I know the claimants land. It is in Waikalua, Kaneohe.

1st is 5 Lois.

2nd is 3 Lois.

3rd is one Fish pond.

4th is a House lot.

1st is bounded Mauka by Poalima of Waikalua, Koolauloa by Mahoe's land, Makai by the Ili of Keana, Kailua by Waikalua creek.

2nd is bounded Mauka by "Mahinui" an Ili, Oopa's Lois, Koolauloa by Kalokoai an Ili, Makai by Keawakuhia's Lois, Kailua by Kaula's Lois.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Kalokoai, Koolauloa by my Lois "Kaeleku", Makai by Kakalahee a Fish pond, Kailua by the Ili of Hanalua. 3rd is called Kakalahai 1.

4th is bounded Mauka by Makakea's House lot, Koolauloa by "Eku", Makai by the sea beach, Kailua by Kaneohe creek.

The claimant received this land from Keikiakamai in the days of Liholiho and his title was never disputed until a few months since, when Kawana took away the Puuone or small fish pond to feed small fish for his large pond near by.

Kumuhonua sworn says I know the Puuone in dispute between Paele and Kawana. "Kakalakee" is the name of it. I am a son of Kaneohe and know Paele's title. He has had it from the days of Liholiho and held it in peace. The Konohiki has never asserted any right in it, or claimed any of the fish until Kawana did so this present year.

Kaniau sworn I am a Kamaaina of Kaneohe and know the Puuone in dispute between Paele and Kawana. It has belonged to Paele and Paele alone, from the days of Liholiho and the Konohiki has never had or asserted any right therein until Kawana who took it away from Paele only a few months since. (v. 11/18-19)

Kaneohe March 13, 1850 (v. 11/21)

2310 Hoonaulu

Puhi sworn, says I know the land of the claimant. It is in Waikapoki nui, Kaneohe.

1st is 5 Lois.

2nd is 1 Loi.

3rd is 1 Loi.

1st is bounded Mauka by the Wailele river, Koolauloa by “Wailele” Kumuhonua’s land, Makai by Opu’s land, Kailua by the Wailele river.

2nd is bounded Mauka by Opu’s lois, Koolauloa by Kahuaia’s loi, Makai by Poalima Loi and Opu’s, Kailua by the Wailele river.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the Loi Poalima, Koolauloa by Wahaulaula’s loi, Makai by Papohaku a Fish pond, Kailua by the Wailele creek or river.

The claimant received these lands from Alapai the Konohiki of Waikapoki nui about 1845 and he has possessed them in peace, going to the Poalima until within this last year, when Alapai took away no. 3. Alapai took it away because he wished to, I know of no other reason. He might have taken away the remaining six Lois as well as this one.

Wahaulaula sworn, says I am a resident of Kaneohe and one of the Hoaainas of Waikapoki. I know the Kalo patch in dispute between Hoonaulu and Alapai. It was given to him by Alapai about 3 or 4 years since and he held it in peace until this year when Alapai took it away. Why he did so I know not, as the man went to his Poalima and paid all the taxes.

(The claimant said Alapai reserved the right to run his fish in the large Loi in dispute between the hills of Kalo.)(v. 11/21-22)

8237 laukea

Kaheana sworn, I know the land claimed by laukea but he never had any title in it, he only worked it for another. It is now in the hands of Liipoa the Konohiki of the Ili of Kailiili, Waikane, Oahu. The claimant has forsaken his residence in Waikane, and gone to Waikiki to live. He restored the land to Liipoa from whom he received it, before he left Waikane. (v. 11/22)

5615 Kamai

Kaheana sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Waikane, Oahu, and know this land, which is claimed by Kamai. It consists of the following pieces.

1st is 3 Lois in the Ili of Kumuniu.

2nd is 2 Lois in the Ili of Kokowaleole.

3rd is 1 Loi in the Ili of Kokowaleole.

The claimant also has a House lot adjoining the 3 Lois in Kumuniu.

Kohulikea sworn, says I know the lands of Kamai, I am a Kamaaina of Waikane. They are as described by Kaheana.

1st is bounded Mauka by Ku's land in Kumuniu, Koolauloa by Ku's House lot, Makai by Alanui Aupuni, Kailua by the Waikane creek.

2nd is bounded Mauka by waste land of Konohiki's called "Kamalua", Koolauloa by Hipo's loi called "Kamuliwai", Makai by Makanui's loi called "Kaihuna", Kailua by Manulii's loi called "Kaakau".

3rd is bounded Mauka by land of Kaikaina's, Koolauloa by Mahoe's and Wahalolo's land, Makai by Kauhi's land "Kaihuna", Kailua by my land.

The claimant received this land from his parents and they got it in the days of Kamehameha 1st and his title was never disputed. I am a Kamaaina of Waikane. Kamai died in 1849 and his heir Kaneheana has held possession of the land ever since. Kaneheana is his only child. His mothers name is Kaheananui. (v. 11/23-24)

5954 Moku

Kekoaihulukea sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Waikane and know the claimants land in that Ahupuaa. His land is in the following pieces.

1st is 22 very small Lois in the Ili of Puupuhi.

2nd is one large Loi in the Moo of Kapulonihoawa.

He has a House lot and Kula adjoining his 22 Lois all in the Ili of Puupuhi.

1st is bounded Mauka by the Waikane creek, Koolauloa by Pueo pali, Makai by Keawawakupapau and "Mamani" Ili, Kailua by the Waikane creek.

2nd is bounded Mauka by Palauhlulu's loi, Koolauloa by Koma's loi, Makai by "Ulunui" a Loi, Kailua by Kamakani's loi.

The claimant received 1st from his parents who had it in the days of Kamehameha 1st and he has held it in peace up to this time. 2nd he received from Kanealae from 1840. I have known of his possessing it without dispute. He had it however long before 1840.

Palauhulu sworn, says I am an old resident of Waikane and can verify as I now do, the testimony of Kekoaihulukea. (v. 11/24-25)

5919 Palauhulu

Kaheana sworn, says I am a son of Waikane and know the land of the claimant. It consists of 11 Lois in the Moo of Kaaipuaa and one Loi in the Moo of Kapulonihoawa and a House lot and Kula.

It is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Koolauloa by the Church lot, Makai by sea beach, Kailua by Auwai of Kailili.

The claimant received this land from Kamaili in 1841 or rather his wife Puoanui received it from Kamaile who was her husband, and he had it from the days of Kamehameha 1st. After the death of Kamaile Puoanui married the claimant and he has had quiet possession of it ever since. There are many natives living on the Kula under Palauhulu. I am one of them.

Kekoaehulukea sworn, verified the testimony given by Kaheana. (v. 11/25)

5938 Papahu

Kekoaehulukea sworn, says I know the land of the claimant. It is in Waikane, Oahu, and consists of the following pieces.

1st is 3 Lois and a House lot in the Ili of Kaiki, Waikane.

2nd is one Loi in the Ili of Mamani.

3rd is a Coffee field, a Moo known by the name of Waikееkee in the Ili of Kahalaa.

1st is bounded Mauka by the Waikane creek, Koolauloa by Poalima Lois and Kamoewai a Loi, Makai and Kailua the sea beach.

2nd is bounded Mauka and Koolauloa by Kaheana's Loi, Makai by the pali, Kailua by Waikane creek.

3rd is bounded Mauka and Koolauloa by Waikееkee creek, Makai and Kailua by the pali.

The claimant is an old man and received 1st from Kapioho and he and his ancestors have lived on this spot from the days of Kamehameha 1st. He got the Kalo part of it from Kapioho in 1840 in exchange for other land. 2nd he received from Kaikaina in 1834. 3rd he received from Pueueu the Konohiki in the days of Kaomi, 1834 perhaps. His title is not disputed to any of these lands.

Kaheana sworn, says the testimony of Kekoaehulukea is true.

Kaikaina sworn, says I am a son of Waikane and know the testimony of Kekoaehulukea to be true. (v. 11/26-27)

5714 Keawe

Kaheana sworn, says the claimant has forsaken Waikane and gone to Waiahole to live. He has given up his claim to the Konohiki Mr. Hall. (v. 11/27)

5712 Kuluahi

Kaheana sworn, says the claimants land in Waikane consists of the following pieces.

1st is 2 Lois in the Moo of Kahaiao.

2nd is a House lot in the Moo of Kaapoko.

1st is bounded Mauka by Kepau's Lois, Koolauloa by the Kula of Kahaiao, Makai by the sea beach, Kailua by Nahelehele lois "Kohi".

2nd is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Koolauloa by Kula of Kaapoko, Makai by an Auwai and pali, Kailua by the Church lot and Kamaka's lot.

The claimant received 1st from Kaneulu the Konohiki in the days of Kinau and also 2nd. His title is not disputed and never was.

Makanui sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Waikane. The testimony of Kaheana is true. (v. 11/28)

6051 Wahilua

Kaheana sworn says I know the lands of the claimant in Waikane. It is one piece of two Lois in the Ili of "Kumumiu" and a House lot and Kula adjoining. It is bounded Mauka by Kaneheana's land, Koolauloa by Mahoe's and Melani's House lots, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kailua by Waikane creek.

Kumuhonua sworn, says claimants land is in the Ili of Waiape, and his House in Ili Lipuna.

1st is 5 Kalo patches in Waiape.

2nd is a House lot in Kipuna.

1st is bounded Mauka by Nakahuelua's kalo land, Koolauloa by pali of Waiape, Makai by Pehia's kalo and a Poalima, Kailua by Kaneohe creek.

2nd is bounded Mauka and Koolauloa by upland of Lipuna, Makai and Kailua by a small brook.

Claimants title to the Kalo land is from Nahalelaau or his Agent Peha in the year 1844 and has had it undisturbed from that time. His House lot he received from his ancestors and is confirmed by Keliiholomoku the Konohiki.

Kukona testifies to the truth of the above statement. (v. 11/57)

1966 Opu

Kumuhonua sways under oath I know claimants land. It is in Kaneohe.

1st is 4 Lois in Waikapoki.

2nd is 1 Loi in Waiape.

3rd is 1 Loi in Wailele.

4th is a House and lot in Wailele.

1st is bounded Mauka by Hoonaulu's kalo land, Koolauloa by the Ili of Wailele, Makai by Kahuia's kalo land and a Poalima, Kailua by the creek of Wailele.

2nd is bounded Mauka and Kailua by Kumuhonua's kalo land, Koolauloa by Pahia's kalo land, Makai by Kapaula's kalo land

3rd is bounded Mauka, Koolauloa and Makai by Kauikea's kalo land, Kailua by Koenakaia and a Poalima.

4th is bounded Mauka by the road, Koolauloa and Makai by upland of Lipuna, Kailua by Wailele.

The Kalo land in Waikapoki was given to claimant by Wahineino in the time of Liliha. The Kalo land in Waiape was given by Peha in the year 1840. The Kalo land and House lot in Wailele was given by Kanikea in 1845. Claimant has had them in peace to the present time.

Kuaikolia testifies to the truth of the above statements. (v. 11/58)

1st is bounded Mauka, Koolauloa by the Kula of Kanoholuiwi, Makai by Kula of Lipuna, Kailua by kalo land of Papaeaeae.

2nd is bounded Mauka and Kailua by the kalo land of Manene, Koolauloa by the kalo land of Keau, Makai by the Fish pond Kalokohou.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the kalo land of Opu, Koolauloa by a small brook, Makai by kalo land of Koenakaia, Kailua by kalo land of Malia Kauikea.

4th is bounded Mauka and Koolauloa by the upland of Lipuna, Makai by road, Kailua by House lot of Nahinu.

Claimant received his land (1st) from Puhalahua in the time of Liholiho, 2nd from Kuaikolia in the time of Liliha. 3rd from Kauikea in the year 1845. 4th from Kala in 1836. No one has disputed his title. But there is a dispute between him and Nahinu and Kala about the boundary between the House lots of claimant and Nahinu.

Punahale sworn, says he is a native of Kaneohe and knows claimants land. Kapowa is the name of the Ili.

1st is 5 potato patches.

2nd is 5 Gourd fields.

3rd is a House lot in Kuaauhi.

4th is 1 Kalo patch in Keahala.

5th is 3 Salt pits in Kaluapuhi.

6th is 5 potato patches in Ulupau.

1st is bounded Mauka by the land of Lihue, Koolauloa by the land of Kane, Makai by a high hill, Kailua by the sea beach.

2nd is bounded Mauka and Koolauloa by the land of Lihue, Makai by land of Kaneohe, Kailua by land of Kekai.

3rd is bounded Mauka by the upland of Lihue, Koolauloa by the House lot of Kuaia, Makai and Kailua by a brook.

4th is bounded Mauka by a Loi Poalima, Koolauloa and Makai by kalo land of Punahale, Kailua by kalo land of Kapunae.

5th is bounded Makua and Koolauloa by the salt pit of Lihana, Makai by Kula of Nakahuna, Kailua by salt pit of Kuaana.

6th is bounded Mauka by the upland of Kuaia, Koolauloa and Makai by a hill called Kooleahauwe, Kailua by upland of Nakahuna.

1st, 2nd and 3rd were given claimant by Kuaia in 1834, 4th by Panalaa in 1846, 5th by Kaakau in 1837. 6th by Kekai in 1843.

No one has disputed claimants right to any of the above lands till the present month (March 1850) when the new Konohiki took the one Kalo patch (no. 4) from the occupant. The Konohiki's plea for taking it is that it was long ago a Poalima. Witness says it never was a Poalima.

Kuaia testifies to the truth of the above. He is an old inhabitant and says the Kalo patch taken by the new Konohiki has not been a Poalima. (v. 11/60-61)

6th is a House lot in the Ili Kumunui.

1st is bounded Mauka by Pueuwau's loi, Koolauloa by the river of Kahalaa, Makai by Kauhoi's land and a Poalima, Kailua by the river of Kanuehu.

2nd is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki, Koolauloa by river Maniamane, Makai by Konohiki's lois, Kailua by Kaneana's and Kane's land.

3rd is bounded Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki, Koolauloa and Kailua by hill called Makaohala.

4th is bounded Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki, Koolauloa by hill Palalauhala, Kailua by hill Kamohailio.

5th is bounded Mauka and Kailua by hill Nuapuaa, Koolauloa by hill Nuapuaa and a river, Makai by Konohiki.

6th is bounded Mauka by house lot of Kaikaina, Koolauloa by grove of Hau trees, Makai by the Konohiki, Kailua by Kaneheana's land.

Rev. James Kekela sworn, says at the time he was drawing up claims for the people of Kawela, the son of Kaili came to him and got Kaili's claim drawn up by witnesses. It was put in a parcel with other claims and given to Rev. Mr. Emerson to bring to Honolulu.

Kane sworn, says he knows the land of Kaili in Kawela. It consists of 5 Kalo patches in two pieces.

1st of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kookoo's land, Makai by Kauaula's land.

2nd of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kookoo's land, Makai by Kelemana's land.

Claimants House site is Makai of the land. It is enclosed with a wooden fence, there is one house in it. Claimant held the land for about 12 years. He died in march 1849 leaving his property to his daughter Nahuli. (v. 11/239)

Kahuku Sept. 25, 1850 (v. 11/241)

4281 Kaunahi

Ewa sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kaunahi in Laie. It consists of 8 Kalo patches, a piece of uncultivated Kula land, and a House site. Maii sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Aamaka in Laie. It consists of 8 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula land and a House site. The 8 Kalo patches form 4 pieces.

1st of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Kuku's land, Mauka by Moanauli's land, Waialua side by Maii's land, Makai by Pupuka's land.

2nd of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Ihupai's land, Mauka by Koula's land, Waialua side by Keliwaiwaiole's land, Makai by Kamaneo's land.

3rd of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Hakailani's land, Waialua side by Mahoe's land, Makai by Puaokahala's land.

3728 Ewa

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land of Ewa in Laie. It is the same as that claimed by Koi, no. 4272.

Ewa the claimant appeared in person and withdrew his claim in favor of his father Koi. He sent in his claim not knowing that his father had claimed the same land. (v. 11/245)

3774 Alaala (deceased)

Paakahi sworn, says Alaala died during the prevalence of the measles leaving his land to Kalua.

Witness knows the land claimed by Alaala in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches planted, and a House site. The 3 patches form one piece, bounded on Hauula side by Kamaneo's land, Mauka by Keao's land, on Waialua side by Laielolohe's land, Makai by Paakahi's land.

Claimants House site is Makai, it is not enclosed. He lived on the land from olden times, does not know how long. The Kula land claimed by Alaala has not been cultivated for some time past.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim, except the Kula. (v. 11/245)

3731 Ihupu

The House lot is not enclosed, it is distinct from the land. There is one house on it.

Claimant derived the land from his ancestors.

The Agent of the Konohiki consents to this claim. (v. 11/249)

3695 Manuiki (deceased)

Kauaikaua sworn, says Manuiki died in 1848, leaving his property to Mahakea, who now represents this claim.

Mahakea appeared in person, and stated that he wished to withdraw the claim, because the land is worth nothing. (v. 11/251)

3408 Moanauli

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Moanauli in Laie. It consists of 4 Kalo patches, bounded on Hauula and Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Napahu's land, Makai by Pupuka's land.

The Kula land has not been cultivated for some years. Claimant has held the land for about 15 years.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/251)

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Maii in Laie. It consists of 7 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula land and a House lot.

3rd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Paakahhi's land, Mauka by Kauhalekua's land, Waialua side by Napahu's land, Makai by Kahili's land.

Claimant has a piece of cultivated Kula land also, planted with potatoes. It is surrounded by the Konohiki's land, about half an acre, enclosed with a stone wall.

Claimants House lot is adjacent from the land, it is not well enclosed. There is one house on it. He derived the land from his wife's parents who held it from the time of Kamehameha II.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/255)

Kamaikahulipu a former Konohiki, gave this patch in charge to Pia to take care of as an Under Luna. It has always been considered the property of the Konohiki from the time of Kamehameha 1st. In it is the Spring which supplies all the Kalo land with water.

The House lot of claimant is near the seaside, it is not enclosed.

The 8 patches form one piece, bounded on Hauula side by Kamakaokaia's land, Mauka by Mahiole's land, Waialua side by Keliwaiowaiole's, Makai by Hakaiolani's land. The House site is Makai, it is not enclosed. Claimant lived on the land from his youth.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/261)

3864 Paiakea

The Kula land is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki. It is enclosed with a Hau fence and well cultivated. The House lot is near the seaside, enclosed with a stone wall.

Claimant has held the land for over 10 years.

3rd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Napuaokahala's land, Mauka by Kauhane's land, Waialua side by Aamakaiki's land, Makai by Kauhane's land.

4th piece has not been cultivated for over two years, it is Nahelehele.

The House site of claimant is Makai, it is not enclosed. There is one house on it.

The Kula land claimed has not been cultivated for some time.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/271)

4301 Kanakanui

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land of Kanakanui in Laie. It consists of 10 Kalo patches, 2 pieces of Kula land, and a House site. The 10 patches form 4 pieces.

1st piece of 4 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Koi's land, Mauka by Kauaikaua's land, Waialua side by Waikupuhoalani's land, Makai by Mahahea's land.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kaunahi's land, Mauka by Mahoe's land, Waialua side by Mahakea's land, Makai by Keao's land.

3rd piece of 4 patches is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

4th piece of one patch is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

1st piece of Kula land is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki. It is planted in Watermelons.

2nd piece of Kula land is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki. It is planted with Tobacco.

The House lot is Makai, it is not enclosed. There is one house on it.

Claimant derived the land from his ancestors.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/273)

3873 Paakahi

Kuku sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Paakahi in Laie. It consists of 8 Kalo patches, a piece of cultivated Kula land and a House site. The 8 patches form 4 pieces.

1st piece of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka and Waialua side by Kalua's land, Makai by Kauhane's land.

2nd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Mahunalii's land, Mauka by Hakaioalani's land, on Waialua side by Kauhalekua's land, Makai by Kuku's land.

3rd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Waialua side by Powahi's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki.

4th piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Hoopau's land, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Hakaioalani's land.

The Kula land is not cultivated. The House site is Makai. There is one house on it, it is not enclosed.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/275)

3729 Eku

Kaunahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Eku in Laie. It was taken away from Eku in 1848 by the Konohiki because he would not pay the annual tax. The Konohiki had to pay the tax himself. (Claimant in person confirmed this statement.)

The Agent of the Konohiki has placed someone else on the land and claims it for C. Kanaina.

Kaunahi sworn, says claimant's House lot is Makai, it is not enclosed. (v. 11/277)

4003 Hano

Kauaiamanu sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Hano in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula land and a House lot. The 3 patches are bounded on Hauula side by Maii's land, Mauka by Moanauli's land, Waialua side by Kaluaiewa's land, Makai by Kauaiamanuu's land.

The Kula land is planted with Tobacco and Bananas. It is bounded on Hauula side by Kauaiamanu's land, Mauka by Napahu's land, Waialua and Makai by the Konohiki.

The House lot is in another place, it is not enclosed. Claimant has held the land for 9 years.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/277)

Laie Sept. 23, 1850 (v. 11/279)

3998 Hina

Keao sworn, says he knows the land, the greater part of it is now Naelehele. There is no part of it now planted. Hina died in 1848 and his land fell to the Konohiki who has given it to other persons to cultivate.

(This was confirmed by others present, and Keao who was the only person who could set up a claim, declined to do so.)(v. 11/279)

4021 Lakee

Kaualewa sworn, says Lakee died in 1850 leaving the land to Mahakea who now claims it. The land of Lakee is included in that of Mahakea his heir, claim no. 3699.

This was confirmed by others present and no person disputed Mahakea's right.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/279)

9968 Lauwalu

Kauaiomano and Paakahi sworn, says the land claimed by Lauwalu belongs to them, as stated in claimants letter to the Commissioners. He has no claim in Laie. (This was confirmed by others present, and no one appeared to represent the claim.)lv. 11/279)

4298 Kaualewa

Kalimakuhi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kaualewa in Laie. The greater part of it has not been cultivated for several years. Claimant has one Kalo patch, bounded on Hauula side by Paakahi's land, Mauka by Kahoolai's land, Waialua side by Nakahili's land, Makai by Kekui's land.

Claimant has also a House site, it is not enclosed. It is distinct from the land.

Claimant has held the land for about 10 years.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281.(v. 11/279)

3697 and 3709 Mahoe

Kamamai sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Mahoe in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, a piece of uncultivated Kula land and a House site. The 3 patches form 2 pieces.

1st piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Kiniakua's land, Mauka by Ku's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Kamauoha's land.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Aamaka's land, Mauka by Kauhana's land, Waialua side by Paakahi's land, Makai by Kaleo's land. The House site is separate from the land, it is not enclosed.

Claimant has held the land for seven years. The Kula land is not cultivated.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696.(v. 11/281)

3696 Mahunalii

Kauaikaua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Mahunalii in Laie. It consists of 5 Kalo patches in one piece, a piece of Kula land and a House site.

The 5 patches are bounded on Hauula side by Kanaikaua's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kowa's land, Makai by Kahoukua's land.

The Kula land is surrounded by the Konohiki's land. It is planted with Wauke.

The House site adjoins the Kalo patches and is not enclosed.

Claimant has held this land for three years.

John Harbottle, Agent for C. Kanaina, objected to this claim and to all the others on Laie on the ground of an arrangement said to have been made between Kanaina and the Makaainanas in regard to their lands. (v. 11/281)

9894 Nawai

Kalimakuhi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Nawai in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, 2 of which have not been cultivated for over two years.

The patch which is planted is bounded on Hauula side by Kua's land, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Napahu's land.

Witness also knows the land of claimant in Malaekahana. It is a piece of Kula land planted with Wauke, Banana etc. It is bounded on Hauula side by Kua's land, Mauka and Waialua side by Kauanui's land, Makai by Kahoowaha's land.

Claimants House site is in Malaekahana, it is not enclosed. He derived the land from his ancestors, does not know exactly the length of occupancy.

The Agent of the Konohiki of Laie had no other objections to make to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/283)

3945 Napahu

Mahakea sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Napahu in Laie. It consists of 2 Kalo patches and a House site. The two Kalo patches form 2 pieces.

1st patch is bounded on Hauula and Makai sides by Poiuahi's land, Mauka by Kamauoha's land, Waialua side by Mahoe's land.

2nd patch is bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kua's land, Waialua side by Kamauoha's land, Makai by Poouahi's land.

The House site is Makai, not enclosed. Claimant has held the land over ten years.

The Kula land claimed has not been cultivated for some time.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection this than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/285)

3865 Palupalu

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Palupalu in Laie. It is included in that of Maii, no. 3714. (Sent two years to Palupalu, he being old and infirm, to ask if he had any claim. He sent back word that he had given the land to Maii some time ago.)(v. 11/285)

3936 B Newa

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Newa in Laie. It has been uncultivated for two years. Newa left Laie in 1848, thinks he went to California. (This was confirmed by others.)

The Agent of the Konohiki claims this land for C. Kanaina. (v. 11/285-287)

3789 Opala

Kalimakuhi sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch claimed by Opala in Laie. It has not been cultivated for 2 years. (This was confirmed by others present.)

The Agent of the Konohiki claimed this land for C. Kanaina.

Honolulu May 15, 1852.

Napahu, Hooh, Ua ike no au I koua Apana aina Kula ma Laie. Penei na palama,

Mauka, Kahuku, Hauula ko ke Konohiki aina, Makai ko Keliwaiwaiole aina.

Ua loaa ia ia kua mau Apana no kona mau makua mai mamananaku o ke kau ana o ke Kanawai I ka M.H. 1839, a ua loaa I kona mau makua I ka wa o Kamehameha 1st, a ua noho mau no a hiki I ko lakou make ana, a hooili mai o Opala I kua mau wahi ia Kalimakuhi, a ken oho nei no oia malaila a hiki I keia wa, aole mea keakea.

Kaleo, Hooh. Ua like no kou ike me kou Napahu I hoike ai nei. Aole no mea keakea. (v. 11/287)

4279 Kahiamoe

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kahiamoe in Laie.

It was taken away by the Konohiki in 1848 because the annual tax was not paid. The Konohiki had to pay the tax himself and he has since placed another person on the land.

The Agent of the Konohiki claims this land for C. Kanaina. (v. 11/287)

4299 Kaluahine

Paakahi sworn, says Kaluahine died in 1848 leaving neither widow nor child, nor any other heir known of. (This was confirmed by those present, and no person appeared to represent the claimant.)

The Agent of the Konohiki claims this land for C. Kanaina. (v. 11/287)

4292 Kaumeheniho

Paakahi sworn, says the land claimed by Kaumeheniho consisted of one Kalo patch and a piece of Kula land which belonged to the Konohiki.

The land was given to Kaumeheniho to take care of only for the Konohiki. Claimant died in 1848 and the land reverted to the Konohiki, whose Agent now claims it for C. Kanaina. (v. 11/289)

8439 Kini

Keliwaiwaiole sworn, says claimant left Laie in 1848 and went to Honolulu to live. Before he left Laie he gave up his land to the Konohiki's Agent, who gave it to someone else to cultivate. Kini died in Honolulu. (This was confirmed by those present and no person appeared to represent the claim.)

The Agent of the Konohiki claimed the land. (v. 11/289)

4328 Kamaneo

Claimant appeared in person and stated that he had paid no taxes for the land for 3 years. The Konohiki's Agent took away his land two years ago. Peka who owned one half of this land took away claimants part of it because he did not pay the tax. Claimant says he makes no claim to it now. (v. 11/289)

4327 Kini (deceased)

Kalua sworn, says Kini his father, died in 1848, leaving his land to Koula one of his sons, who has included it in his land. The land belonged by right to Koula. (This was confirmed by others present.)(v. 11/290)

4346 Kawahinewiwi (deceased)

Kauaikana sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Wahinewiwi in Laie. Claimant died in 1848 leaving two children. They deserted the land occupied by their father and went to another part of the Island to live. The land fell to the Konohiki who has since given it to other people to cultivate.

Part of it is included in other claims. (This was confirmed by others present and no person appeared to represent the claim.)(v. 11/290)

6989 Kahuailua

Poouahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kahuailua in Laie. It consists of 5 Kalo patches and a House site. The 5 patches form two pieces.

1st piece of 4 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Laieloloha's land, Mauka by Hoopau's land, Waialua side by Kauhana's land, Makai by Kahili's land.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Keao's land, Mauka by Mahakea's land, Waialua and Makai side by Koula's land.

The House site is in Malaekahana, it is not enclosed. Claimant has held the land for ten years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/291)

4325 Kahoale

Mahakea sworn, says he knows the land of Kahoale in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, a small piece of Kula land and a House site. The 3 patches make 2 pieces.

1st piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Pupuka's land, Mauka by Kamamai's land, Waialua side by Nakahili's land, Makai by Keliwaiwaiole's land.

2nd piece of 1 patch and Kula land is bounded Makai by Kekui's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki.

The House lot is separate, it is not enclosed. Claimant has held this land for 8 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/291)

4333 Kahoukua

Papaiea sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Laie. It consists of 5 patches (Kalo), 2 pieces of Kula land and a House site. The 5 patches form 2 pieces.

1st piece of 4 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Kananui's land, Mauka by Kuku's land, Waialua side by Mahakea's, Makai by Puhibaka's land.

2nd piece of 1 patch is bounded on Hauula side by Makaiki's land, Mauka and Waialua side by Hoopau's land, Makai by Laieloloha's land.

1st piece of Kula land is surrounded by the Konohiki's land. It is planted with Potatoes.

2nd piece of Kula land is planted with Tobacco. It is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

The House site is Makai, it is enclosed with a wooden fence. Claimant derived the land from his father. Length of occupancy uncertain.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696. (v. 11/292)

4330 Kuaio (deceased)

Kamano sworn, says Kuaio died in 1848, leaving his land to Kahoukua in whose claim (4333) it is included.

Keliwaiwaiole sworn, confirmed this statement. (v. 11/292)

4338 Kahalelaau

Kauaikaua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kahalelaau in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches and a House site. The 3 patches are bounded on Hauula side by Keliwaiwaiole's land, Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Pulehu's land. The Kula land is not cultivated.

The House site is Makai, not enclosed. Claimant derived the land from his father, does not know how long ago.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/293)

4290 Kaiolohia

Paiakea sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Laie. It consists of 4 Kalo patches, 3 pieces of Kula land and a House site. The 4 patches form 2 pieces.

1st piece of 2 patches is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

2nd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula and Waialua sides by Waikupulani's land, Mauka by Pupuka's land, Makai by Kaonohi's land.

1st piece of Kula land is planted with Tobacco.

2nd piece of Kula land is planted with Potatoes. Both are surrounded by the Konohiki's land.

3rd piece is not cultivated.

The House site is Makai, two houses on it, not enclosed.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/293)

3789 B Kalimakuhi

Kua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kalimakuhi in Laie. It consists of one Kalo patch, a piece of Kula land and a House site. The Kalo patch is bounded Makai by Mahiole's land, on all

other sides by the Konohiki. The Kula land is bounded on Hauula side by a stream, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Napahu's land, Makai by a watercourse. It is planted with Wauke.

The House site is near the river, not enclosed. Claimant has held the land for ten years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this than to no. 3696, pg. 281.

(Note this objection did not affect that claim.)(v. 11/294)

4288 Kaonohi

Claimant appeared in person and stated that the greater part of the land embraced in this claim is now uncultivated as he has acquired the land of Lalapa. He has one Kalo patch yet in cultivation.

Mahakea sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch of Kaonohi in Laie. It is bounded on Hauula side by Mahakea's land, Mauka by Kaiolohia's land, Waialua side by Waikupulani's land, Makai by Waiakea's land. Claimant has held this patch over ten years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696.

Honolulu March 20, 1852.

Mahakea stated that he was ready to give the particulars of two other lots at this time, but did not do so because Mr. Robertson was engaged with others. He said claimant had a House lot and a Kula lot apart. (v. 11/294-295)

4286 Kanehoa

Mahakea sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kanehoa in Laie. It consists of some Kula land in Laiemaloo and a House site. The Kula land has not been cultivated since last year. Claimant appears to have given up the cultivation of the land. His House site is Makai, it is not enclosed.

The Agent of the Konohiki objected to the claim for Kula land as it is not cultivated. (v. 11/295)

4342 Kapuaokahala (deceased)

Kalimakuhi sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Laie. It consisted of 4 Kalo patches, which did not belong to claimant, he got leave from other people to plant on their patches and when he died the patches reverted to them.

Witness knows the land of claimant in Malaekahana. It consists of 4 separate pieces of Kula land.

1st piece is planted in Wauke etc., and surrounded by the Konohiki's land.

2nd, 3rd and 4th pieces are surrounded by the Konohiki's land, and planted with Potatoes, Noni, Bananas, Wauke etc. Claimants House lot is not enclosed. He derived this land from his

ancestors. He died in 1848 leaving his land to Kauonnu. He was the Konohiki's Agent on Malaekahana. (v. 11/295)

4291 Kapule (deceased)

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kapule in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula land and a House site. The 3 patches form 3 pieces.

1st patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kaleo's land, Mauka by Kawaiomanui's, Waialua side by Elemakule's land, Makai by Puhibaka's land.

2nd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Mahuualii's, Mauka by Kuku's land, Waialua side by Waikupulani's, Makai by Kahoukua's land.

3rd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Mahuualii's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kahiwhine's, Makai by Kuku's land.

The Kula land is partly in Malaekahana. It is surrounded by the Konohiki's land and planted with Wauke.

The House site is Mauka, distinct from the land, not enclosed. Claimant lived on the land all his life. He died in 1848 leaving his land to Kaleo who now claims it.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/296)

4345 Kaumiumi

Kauwaiomanu sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kaumiumi in Laie. It was given by the Konohiki to Kaumiumi to care of, and he cultivated it. Claimant died in 1848 leaving his land to Kiniakua.

It consists of one Kalo patch and a House site. The Kula land has not been cultivated for a long time. The Kalo patch is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by Kamauoha's land, Mauka by Kahalelaau's land, Waialua side by Ki's land.

The House site is near the river, not enclosed. Claimant held the land for 5 years before his death.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/297)

4300 Kapule

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kapule in Laie. It consists of 2 Kalo patches and a piece of Kula land. The 2 Kalo patches are bounded on Hauula side by Kanakanui's land, Mauka by Kauaikaua's, Waialua and Makai side by Mahakea's land. The Kula land is surrounded by the Konohiki's land. It was lately planted with Potatoes and contains about an acre. This land does not

belong to Kapule. It belongs to Waikupulani his father in law, and has been wrongfully claimed by Kapule.

Waikupulani appeared in person and claimed this land as his. He never gave it to Kapule (this was confirmed by those present). The House site is Makai, not enclosed.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/297)

4283 Koula

Kalua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Koula in Laie. It consists of 5 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula land and a House site.

The 5 patches are bounded on Hauula side by Kahuailua's land, Mauka by Pia's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Hoopau's land.

The Kula land is bounded on Hauula side by Ihupu's land, Mauka by Kaohu's land, Waialua and Makai side by the Konohiki. It is planted with Tobacco and Melons. The House site is Makai, not enclosed, two houses on it.

Claimant derived the land from his ancestors.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/298)

4343 Kauaiomano

Kauaikaua sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Laie. It consists of 122 Kalo patches, 7 of which are planted, a piece of Kula land and a House site. 5 of the patches have not been planted for two years.

The 7 Kalo patches which are planted are bounded on Hauula side by Kaleo's land, Mauka by Elemakule's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Kamamai's land.

The Kula land is bounded on Hauula side by Pulehu's land, Mauka by Kaleo's land, Waialua side by the line of Malaekahana, Makai by Kamama's land. It is planted with Wauke. The House site is separate, not enclosed. Claimant derived the land from his ancestors.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/298)

4293 Keawe (deceased)

Kalua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Keawe in Laie. It consists of 8 Kalo patches, 2 pieces of Kula land and a House site.

The 8 Kalo patches are bounded on Hauula and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kahuailua's land, Makai by Hoopau's land.

1st piece of Kula land is bounded on Hauula side by Hoopoe's land, Mauka by Nakahili's land, Waialua side by Koula's land, Makai by Ihupu's land. It is planted with Tobacco.

2nd piece of Kula is included in the boundaries of the 8 Kalo patches.

The House site is Makai, not enclosed. Claimant held his land for over 20 years. Keawe died in 1848, leaving his land to Koihae his daughter.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/298)

3936 Nakahili

Kuku sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Nakahili in Laie. It consists of 5 Kalo patches, 3 pieces of Kula land and a House site. The 5 Kalo patches form 4 pieces.

1st piece, of 2 patches, is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by Kuku's land, Mauka by Mahunalii's, Waialua side by Poouahi's land.

2nd piece of one patch, is bounded on Hauula side by Pupuka's land, Mauka by Moanauli's land, Waialua side by Elemakule's, Makai by Hano's land.

3rd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kekui's land, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Kahoale's land.

4th piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula's side by Kuku's land, Mauka by Keliwaiwai's, Waialua side by Kahoale's land, Makai by the Konohiki.

Two of the pieces of Kula land are separated only by a path. This piece is bounded on Hauula side by Hoopoe's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Aamaka's land, Makai by Kaohu's land.

The other piece of Kula land is bounded on Hauula side by Kaonohi's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kaleo's land, Makai by Pakolu's land.

The House site is distinct from the land, it is not enclosed, two houses on it.

Claimant has held the land for 8 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/299)

9895 Kekauanui

Kauauka sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kekauanui in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches in 3 pieces.

1st patch is bounded on Hauula side by Laielolohe's, Mauka by Hoopau's, Waialua side by Kahuailua's, Makai by Kaloaua's.

2nd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kuahuia's, Mauka by Mahakea's, Waialua side by Paakahi's, Makai by Puaokahala's,

3rd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Paiaolulu's, Mauka and Makai by Akalou's land, Waialua side by Kuku's.

Kalimakuhi sworn says he knows the land of claimant in Malaekahana. It consists of 3 pieces of Kula land.

1st and 2nd pieces are bounded on all sides by the Konohiki, and planted with Wauke and Tobacco.

3rd piece is bounded on Hauula side by Paakahi's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki. It is planted with Wauke, Bananas etc.

The House lot is Makai of the land, it is not enclosed. Claimant derived the land from his ancestors.

4273 Kauhi (deceased)

Paakahi sworn, says Kauhi died in 1848. Before his death he gave his land away to his relatives who have included it in their several claims. (This was confirmed by others present, and no one appeared to represent the claim.)(v. 11/301)

4451 Kuapuu

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kuapuu in Laie. It consists of 5 Kalo patches and a House site. The 5 patches form 4 pieces.

1st piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kaleo's land, Mauka by Namakaokaia's land, Waialua side by Paakahi's, Makai by Kuku's.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kawanui's, Mauka by Mahakea's, Waialua side by Kua's, Makai by Kapuaokahala's.

3rd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Pupuka's land, Waialua side by Kuku's.

4th piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Elemakules, Waialua side by Kuku's, Makai by Poouahi's. The House site is separate, not enclosed. Claimant has held the land for seven years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection this than to no. 3636, pg. 281. (v. 11/301)

3938 B F. Namamoku

Paakahi sworn, says claimant is not now on Laie. He does not know exactly where he has gone to. The land claimed by him is now mostly Nahelehele and has fallen partly to the Konohiki. Some of the land is included in the claims of other persons. (This was confirmed by others present, and no one appeared to represent the claim.)

The Agent of the Konohiki claimed the land for G. Kanaina. (v. 11/301)

3938 Namakaokaia

Mahakea sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Namakaokaia in Laie. The Kalo patch claimed has not been planted for 2 years. The Kula land is also Nahelehele.

Claimant in person confirmed this statement and did not pretend to have any claim to the land.

The Konohiki's Agent claimed the land for G. Kanaina. (v. 11/301)

Laie Sept. 24, 1850 (v. 11/302)

10748 Puhipaka

Kamauoho sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Puhipaka in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula and a House site. The 3 patches form 3 pieces.

1st patch is bounded on Hauula side by Ihupu's land, Mauka by Kaleo's, Waialua side by Kaauwaiomau's, Makai by the Konohiki.

2nd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kouka's, Mauka and Waialua side by Mahakea's, Makai by Koula's land.

3rd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Nahelehele's, Mauka by Kalou's, Waialua and Makai side by Maii's land.

1st piece of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Aamaka's, Mauka by Moanauli's, Waialua side by Hano's, Makai by Kaleo's.

2nd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula and Waialua side by Kuku's land, Mauka by Kaleo's, Makai by Kaiaolohia's.

Claimant has also 3 pieces of Kula land planted.

1st piece is bounded Makai by Kupihea's, on all other sides by the Konohiki.

2nd and 3rd pieces are bounded on all sides by the Konohiki, and planted with Tobacco etc.

The House site is distinct from the land, not enclosed. Claimant has held the land for 15 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/302)

10619 Poouahi

Kauaikaua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Poouahi in Laie. It consists of 14 Kalo patches in 4 pieces.

1st piece of 9 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Nakahili's land, Mauka by Mahunalii's, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Ulukou's.

2nd piece of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Paakahi's, Mauka by Kuku's, Waialua side by Kahoale's, Makai by the Konohiki.

3rd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula and Makai by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kalua's, Waialua side by Kaohu's land.

4th piece of one patch is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted, it adjoins the first piece of 9 Kalo patches.

Claimants House site is Makai of the land, not enclosed. He has held the land from the time of Kamehameha 1st.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/303)

3938 B Puali

Kaiolohia sworn, says Puali has left Laie and gone to reside in another part of Oahu. His land has partly reverted to the Konohiki, and part of it has come into the possession of other people. (This was confirmed by others present, and no one appeared to represent the claim.)(v. 11/303)

10928 Ulukou

Kuku sworn, says he knows the 5 Kalo patches claimed by Ulukou in Laie. One of them is now a Melon patch. The 4 Kalo patches are bounded on Hauula side by Poouahi's land, Mauka by Honu's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Mkaai by Kalimakuhi's. The Melon patch is bounded on Hauula side by Poouahi's, Mauka by Kekauanui's, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Nawai's land. Claimants Kula land has not been cultivated for some time, it is Nahelehele.

He has a House site Makai of his land, not enclosed. Claimant derived the land from his ancestors.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/304)

10763 Puni (deceased)

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Puni in Laie. It consists of 5 Kalo patches in 2 pieces.

1st piece of 4 patches is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by Kaiaolohia's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Pupuka's.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Aamaka's, Waialua side by Kaleo's, Makai by Kane's land. The Kula land claimed has not been planted for two years.

Claimants House site is near the seaside, not enclosed. He held the land for six years.

Puni died in 1848, leaving his land to Paakahi, a boy, his son.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg 281. (v. 11/304)

3743 Wi (deceased)

Poouahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Wi in Laie. It consists of 4 Kalo patches in 2 pieces, 2 pieces of Kula land and a House site.

1st piece of 3 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Mahakea's, Mauka and Waialua side by Poouahi's, Makai by Kalimakuhi's.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Ihupu's, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Pupuka's land.

1st and 2nd pieces of Kula land are bounded on all sides by the Konohiki and planted with Wauke, Bananas etc. The House site is distinct from the land, not enclosed. Claimant held the land for about 20 years.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/305)

4334 Kalou

Keliwaiwaiole Jr. sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kalou in Laie. It consists of 6 Kalo patches in 3 pieces, and a House site. The Kula land claimed is Nahelehele.

1st piece of 4 Kalo patches is bounded on Hauula side by Keliwaiwaiole's, Mauka by a stream, Waialua and Makai side by the Konohiki.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Puhibaka's, Waialua side by Maii's land.

3rd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kananui's, Mauka by Kahoukua's, Waialua side by Mahakea's, Makai by Puhibaka's land.

Claimants House site in Laie Maloo, not enclosed. The great stone wall is one side of it.

Claimant derived the land from his ancestors, and has lived on it from his youth. He is now very old.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/305-306)

4039 Kalawaiaholona (deceased)

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch of claimant in Laie. It is bounded on Hauula side by Kahalelaau's, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Pulehu's land. Witness knows the Kula land of claimant. It is planted with Wauke and bounded on all sides by the Konohiki. Claimant got this land in 1843. He died in Feb. 1850, leaving his land to his brother in Laie, Kaneipu, who now claims it.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/306)

4329 Kalua

Kuku sworn, says he knows the 5 Kalo patches claimed by Kalua in Laie. They form 2 pieces.

1st piece of 4 patches is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kahili's land, Waialua side by Paakahi's.

2nd patch is bounded on Hauula side by Keliwaiwaiole's, Mauka by Koula's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Kekuanui's land.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Wauke. It is bounded on all side by the land of the Konohiki.

His House lot adjoins the first piece of 4 Kalo patches, not enclosed.

Claimant derived the land from his ancestors. Length of his occupancy not known to witness.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/306)

8440 Kamamae

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch of claimant in Laie. It is bounded on Hauula and Waialua sides by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kauaiomanu's, Makai by Kekui's land.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Wauke. It is bounded Mauka by Kauaiomanu's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki. Claimant has also a House site Makai, not enclosed. He has held the land for six years.

The Konohiki's Agent had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/307)

4280 Kauhane

Hakaiolani sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch of claimant in Laie. It is bounded on Hauula side by Keoni's land, Mauka by Paakahi's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Aamaka's land.

Claimants Kula land has been uncultivated for four years, it is Nahelehele. Claimant has held the Kalo patch four years.

The Konohiki's Agent had no objection to this claim. (v. 11/307)

8443 Kauhalekua

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kauhalekua in Laie. It consists of 4 Kalo patches, a Fish pond and a piece of Kula land. The 4 Kalo patches form two pieces.

1st piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Paakahi's land, Mauka by Keliwaiwaiole's, Waialua side by Kahalelaau's, Makai by Mahunalii's land.

2nd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Kahiwhiwa's land, Mauka by Ulukou's land, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Napahu's land.

The Kula land is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki, it is planted with Bananas, Wauke, etc.

Claimants House site is in Malaekahana, it is not enclosed. The Kula land claimed in Malaekahana is Nahelehele. Claimant has held the land in Laie for 15 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696, pg. 281. (v. 11/307)

4336 Kekui

Kahoale sworn, says he knows the land of Kekui in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches and a piece of Kula land, all in one piece, bounded on Hauula side by Kahlili's land, Mauka by Kaualewa's land, Waialua and Makai by the Konohiki.

Claimant has also a House site in Malaekahana, it is enclosed with a wooden fence. Claimant has held the land for 3 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/308)

4270 Keao

Maii sworn, says he knows the 6 Kalo patches of claimant in Laie. They are bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Koi's land, Waialua side by Kahualua's, Makai by Kalua's land.

Claimant has also 4 pieces of Kula land, planted.

1st piece is bounded Mauka by Kahili's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki, planted with Tobacco.

2nd piece is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki, planted with Tobacco.

3rd piece is planted with Wauke, bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

4th piece is planted with Coffee trees, bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

Claimant has a House site distinct from his land, not enclosed. He derived the land from ancestors and has held it 4 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/308)

4361 Kii

Kupehea sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kii in Laie. It consists of 2 Kalo patches, a piece of Kula land and a House site.

The two patches are bounded on Hauula side by Kahalelaau's land, Mauka by Pulehu's, Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Mahoe's land.

The Kula land is bounded on Hauula side by Kauaiomano's, Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kauaikaua's land.

The House site is distinct from the land, not enclosed. Claimant has held this land for over ten years. The land claimed in Malaekahana is Nahelehele.

The Agent of the Konohiki of Laie had no objections to this claim. (v. 11/309)

4326 Koalaukani (deceased)

Kauhane sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Koalaukani in Laie. Four of the Kalo patches are cultivated. They form 2 pieces.

1st piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Puhibaka's land, Mauka by Kauaikaua's, Waialua side by Paiaolulu's, Makai by the Konohiki.

2nd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Hauula side by Koi's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kauakanui's, Makai by Keao's.

Claimant has also 2 pieces of Kula land, planted with Wauke.

1st piece is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki.

2nd piece is bounded Makai by Hano's land, all other sides by the Konohiki.

The House site is distinct from the land, not enclosed. Claimant held the land for over 20 years. He died in 1848 leaving his land to Kaneipu, his child, who now claims it.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/309)

4331 Kamano (deceased)

Kumalai sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kamano in Laie and Kapaka. It consists of 7 Kalo patches in Laie. The balance of the 16 patches claimed have been given by claimant to other people who have included them in their several claims. The 7 patches form 3 pieces.

1st piece of 6 patches is bounded on Hauula and Makai side by a pali, Waialua side by Kolou's land, Mauka by a stream.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Hauula side by Kalua's land, Mauka and Makai by Kahualua's, Waialua side by the Konohiki.

The Kula land claimed by Kamano is Nahelehele. Claimant had a House site in Laie Maoo, not enclosed. Claimant held this land over ten years.

Witness knows the Kalo patches and Kula land claimed by Kamano in Kapaka. One of the patches is a Fish pond. The others have been given up by Kamano's heir to the Konohiki.

Kamano died in 1848 leaving his land to his son Keliwaiwaiole Jr. The Kalo patch or Fish pond in Kapaka is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki's land.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/310)

4269 Kula (deceased)

Paakahi sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kula in Laie. It consists of 3 Kalo patches, planted. The Kula land claimed is Nahelehele. Claimant had also a House site. The 3 Kalo patches are bounded on Hauula side by Napahu's land, Mauka by Kinikua's land, Waialua and Makai side by Poouahi's land.

The House site is Makai, not enclosed.

Claimant held the land for 8 years. Kula died in 1848 leaving his land to his widow Kaawa, who died in 1849, leaving the land to Kamauoho her brother.

The Agent of the Konohiki had no other objection to this claim than to no. 3696 pg. 281. (v. 11/311)

Kahuku Oct. 1, 1850 (v. 11/311)

2767 Naauhau

Kauku sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Naauhau in Pahipahialua. There is none of it cultivated. (This was confirmed by claimant himself.) Claimant has a Fish pond which he held for 16 years. It is surrounded by the Kula land of the Konohiki.

(Naauhau says he has no claim in either Oio or Kaunala.)

The Agent of the Konohiki objected to the claim for the Fish pond by order of C. Kanaina but he could assign no intelligible reason for so doing. (v. 11/311)

2828 Kihewa (deceased)

Wailua sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch claimed by Kihewa in Pahipahialua. It is bounded on Hauula and Mauka side by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kahaleipu's land, Makai by Kuheleloa's land. Claimant has no Kula land in cultivation. He held the Kalo patch about 18 years.

Kihewa died about 2 years ago, leaving her Kalo patch to Puupuu he son, by whom it is now claimed.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to the claim for the Kalo patch. (v. 11/312)

2832 Kaina

Kauku sworn, says he knows the Kalo land of claimant in Pahipahialua. It consists of 4 patches, planted. They are bounded Makai by Kauaua's House site, on all other sides by the Konohiki. The Kula land claimed is not cultivated.

Claimants House site is distinct from his land, not enclosed. He has held the Kalo land for 16 years.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/312)

2763 Niheu

Kauku sworn, says he knows the Kalo land of claimant in Pahipahiallua. It consists of 4 patches, bounded on Hauula side by Kauku's land, Mauka by the Kula land, Waialua and Makai side by Kuheleloa's land. Claimant has also a piece of Kula land enclosed with a stone fence, planted with Potatoes etc. Claimants House site is in this Kula land. The Kula land is bounded on all sides by the land of the Konohiki. He has held the land for 16 years.

Kanoma, Agent of the Konohiki, consented to this claim. (v. 11/313)

2769 Mano (deceased)

Kauku sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch claimed by Mano in Pahipahialua. It is bounded on Hauula side by the Konohiki, Mauka by Kaina's land, Waialua side by Naauhau's land, Makai by Kauaue's land. Claimant has no Kula land in Pahipahialua, nor has he any claim whatever in Waialeale. His House site is in Pahipahialua, near the Kalo patch, not enclosed. Mano died about 2 years ago, leaving his land to Puamana his grandson. Mano held the land 16 years.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/313)

2844 Kauku

Keone sworn, says he knows the Kalo land of Kauku in Pahipahialua. It consists of five patches, bounded on Hauula side by Kaina's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Keone's land, Makai by Kahaleipu's. Claimant has no Kula land in cultivation. His House site is in Waialeale, not enclosed. He has held the Kalo land for 18 years.

Kanoma, Agent of the Konohiki, consented to this claim for Kalo land. (v. 11/314)

2774 Mauoha

Wailua sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kaunala. It is Kula land planted with Potatoes, Bananas etc. It is bounded Makai by a road, on all other sides by the Konohiki. His House site is included in this Kula land. (Mauoha says he has no claim in any other land than Kaunala.) He has held the land in Kaunala for 18 years. He is Agent for the Konohiki-Kaapuiki. (v. 11/314)

2841 Kalauokepau (deceased)

Wailua sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kalauokepau in Kaunala. It has not been cultivated since the death of claimant about 2 years ago. His widow, Kanaue, has removed to Hauula and the land of claimant has fallen into the hands of the Konohiki (whose Agent now claims it for Kaapuiki). (v. 11/315)

4013 Holoakea

Laipoo sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Holoakea in Paumalu. It consists of a piece of cultivated Kula land bounded on Hauula side by Maunui's land, Mauka by Wailua's land, Waialua side by Laipoo's land, Makai by Opunui's land. Claimant has held this land for ten years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/315)

2825 Kalua

Wailua sworn, says he knows the 6 Kalo patches of Kalua in Waialeale. They are bounded on Hauula side by Pahua's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kula land, Makai by the Konohiki and Holi's. Claimant has also a small piece of Kula land adjoining the Kalo patches. His House site is distinct from his land, it is enclosed with a wall. He derived the land from his ancestors. (Kalua says he has no claim in any other land than Waialeale.)

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/315)

3713 Maunui

Laipoo sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Maunui in Paumalu. It consists of some Kula land planted with Potatoes, Bananas etc. Bounded on Hauula side by Pukaloheau's, Mauka by Wailua's land, Waialua side by Laipoo's land, Makai by Holoakea's land. Claimants House lot is included in the above boundaries, it is not enclosed.

He derived the land from his ancestors and has held it for ten years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/316)

4011 Haalou (deceased)

Laipoo sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Haalou in Paumalu. It is planted with Potatoes, Bananas etc., and bounded on Hauula side by Naonohiuli's land, Mauka by Pukaloheau's land, Waialua side by Moonui's land, Makai by Holoakea's land.

Claimants House site is included in the boundaries of the Kula land, it is not enclosed. Claimant held the land for ten years. He died about two years ago, leaving his land to Wailua, who now claims it.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/316)

3950 Naonohiuli (deceased)

Opunui sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Paumalu. It is planted with Potatoes etc. It is bounded on Hauula side by Manuha's land, Mauka by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Maunui's land, Makai by the road.

Claimants House site is included in the boundaries of the Kula land. He held the land for ten years. He died in 1848 leaving his land to his wife Keheeiki.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/317)

3880 Pukaloheau

Opunui sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Paumalu. It is planted with Potatoes etc. and bounded on Waialua side by Laipoo's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki.

The House site of claimant is included in the above boundaries. Claimant has held the land for ten years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/317)

3808 Laipo

Opunui sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Paumalu. It is Kula land planted with Potatoes, Bananas etc. and bounded on Hauula side by Pukaloheau's land, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by the road. The House site of claimant is included in the above boundaries. Claimant has held the land for 16 years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/318)

3776 Opunui

It is Kula land planted with Potatoes etc. and bounded on Hauula side by Pukaloheau's, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by Kalaiku's land. Claimants House site is included in the above boundaries. He has held the land for ten years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim where cultivated. (v. 11/318)

4381 Kalaiku

Opunui sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Paumalu. It is Kula land planted with Potatoes etc. and bounded on Hauula side by Pukaloheau's, Mauka and Waialua side by the Konohiki, Makai by the road. Claimants House site is in this Kula land. He has held the land for 17 years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim where cultivated. (v. 11/319)

4369 Kaahamoa

Opunui sworn, say he knows the Kula land of Kaahamoa in Paumalu. It is planted with Potatoes etc. and bounded on Hauula and Mauka side by the Konohiki, Waialua side by Kalaiku's land, Makai by the road. Claimants House lot is included in the above. He has held the land for 16 years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim where cultivated. (v. 11/319)

3725 Moa

Mamala sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Moa in Paumalu. Claimant abandoned said land about a year ago. He lives now at Waikiki. The land is now in the hands of the Konohiki. (v. 11/319)

Kahuku Oct. 2, 1850 (v. 11/320)

4341 Kaukaha

Claimant has a piece of Kula land also, planted with Potatoes. It may contain about half an acre. His House site is distinct from his land, not enclosed. Claimant has held this land over 20 years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim.

Honolulu Aug. 15, 1851

Kapu's claim is in Kaawa in Koolauloa and enters a complaint that Kenuikapaole has taken from him one large Kalo patch calling it his own. He, Kenuikapaole, has a Moo of his own called Leae, of which this Kalo patch called Kaiaka was originally a Lele. This Kalo patch has been in possession of Kapu for about 16 years, but Kenuikapaole, who has thrown back his own claim into the hands of the Konohiki, has made use of the Konohiki's influence to obtain this Loi nominally for himself but really for the Konohiki (J. Kaeo).

Kaehu sworn, I know this Kalo patch in dispute, having been a resident of Kaaawa ever since the time of Kaomi. At that time and after until the Lunaauhaus were placed on the land (1834) it was waste and uncultivated. Kapu took up this Kalo patch to cultivate it in 1834, and he has cultivated it ever since without interruption till the King made his last tour in September. Since which time when Mr. Robertson took testimony in Koolau, Kenuikapaole denied for the first time this disputed patch to be Kapu's and then laid claim to it himself, saying this patch was a part of his Moo, he having given his Moo to the Konohiki, this also went with it. Kapu has just taken out his food from this patch and Kanuikapaole is planting it under the Konohiki's auspices.

Kii sworn, stated the above testimony was all true as they all knew, and that he has lived at Kaaawa ever since the Fort was built, about 19 years.

Nakai sworn, stated the same.

(The above claims are built, the first, on long possession and cultivation, the last on original right vacated during that space.)

Kioea sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 3 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe side by a stream, Mauka by Ilikahonua's land, Punaluu side by Noanoa's, Makai by the Konohiki.

Claimant has no cultivated Kula land. His House site is distinct from his land and not enclosed. Claimant held the land for 8 years, and died in 1848, leaving the land to Luukia his daughter.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/348)

5945 Papalakea (deceased)

Ilikahonua sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 5 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe and Mauka by Mana's land, Punaluu side by the Kula land, Makai by a pali.

The Kula land claimed has not been cultivated for several years.

Claimants House site adjoins the Kalo land, it is not enclosed. He held the land from about ten years ago. Hale is his heir and now claims the land.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/348)

3062 Kauhiliki

Ilikahonua sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch of claimant in Hakipuu. It is bounded on Kaneohe side by Kaio's land, Mauka and Punaluu side by the Kula land, Makai by Maalea's land.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/350)

3059 Kauai

Kaio sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 6 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded Mauka by Kaio's land, on all other sides by the Konohiki.

The Kula land claimed has not been cultivated for over five years.

Claimants House site adjoins his Kalo land and is not enclosed. He has held the land since 1846.

The Agent of the Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/350)

3054 Kupau

Kaui sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 6 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe side by Hakauila's land, Mauka by the Kula land, Punaluu side by Kilohi's land, Makai by a stream.

Claimants House site adjoins his Kalo land and is not enclosed. He derived the land from his ancestors.

The Konohiki's Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/351)

5939 B Puhi 2

Kaio sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of one Kalo patch bounded on Kaneohe side by Kilohi's land, Mauka by Makaulaula's, Punaluu side by Nakano's land, Makai by Hakkauila's land.

Claimant has a piece of Kula land part of which the Konohiki has planted with Coffee, and in lieu of which the Konohiki's Agent consents to let claimant have half an acre of his Kula land.

Claimant has held the land for 20 years. (v. 11/351)

5655 Keaka

Kaio sworn, says Keaka left Hakipuu in 1848 and now lives in some other part of the Island. His land has been given to another man. (This was confirmed by all present.)(v. 11/351)

2949 Inoino

Kaio sworn, says Inoino left Hakipuu in 1848 and went to some other part of the Island to live. His land fell into the hands of the Konohiki and is now cultivated by someone else. (This was confirmed by all present.)(v. 11/352)

2948 Upea

Kaio sworn, says Upea left Hakipuu and went to reside in some other part of the Island in 1849. She gave up her land to the Konohiki who has given it to someone else. (This was confirmed by all present.)(v. 11/352)

3010 Makaiupu (deceased)

Kaio sworn, says Makaiupu left Hakipuu in 1849 and went to Hawaii, where he died. He left no heir at Hakipuu and his land fell to the Konohiki. (v. 11/352)

2968 Palau (deceased)

Kaio sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch claimed by Palau in Hakipuu. It has not been cultivated for many years.

The Agent of the Konohiki claimed this patch and no one represented the claim of Palau. (v. 11/352)

2998 Nakane

Kaio sworn, says he knows the 3 Kalo patches claimed, they are the property of Makaulaula his son, under whom Nakane planted. These patches are included in the Kuleana of Makaulaula no. 3008. (v. 11/352)

5889 Kalama

Kaio sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kalama in Hakipuu. It belongs to Papalakea (no. 5945) in whose claim it is included and under whom Kalama has been allowed to plant. (This was confirmed by all present.)(v. 11/353)

5889 B Kioea See 3068 true no.

Kuahilani sworn, says he saw Naiapaakai draw up Kioea's claim at the time those of the other people of Hakipuu were drawn up. He supposed that Naiapaakai carried the claim to Honolulu. Witness knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 7 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe side by a stream, Mauka by Kilohi's land, Punaluu side by Kamai's land, Makai by the Konohiki.

Claimants House site adjoins and is partly surrounded by his Kalo land, it is not fenced in. He derived his land from his ancestors who held it in the time of Kamehameha 1st. (The claim is found.)

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/353)

3009 Mana

Claimant appeared in person and withdrew this claim. He wished to removed from Hakipuu and live somewhere else. (v. 11/353)

Waiahole Oct. 30, 1850 (v. 11/354)

5917 Poohiwi (deceased)

Kaneakalau sworn, says Poohiwi died recently when his widow gave up the land of her husband in Kualoa to the Konohiki, and went to reside in another land. (This was confirmed by others present and no one appeared to represent this claim.) see pg. 371. (v. 11/354)

2786 Maalea

PG 232Kepaa sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kualoa. It consists of one Kalo patch bounded on Kaneohe and Mauka side by the Konohiki, Punaluu side by the Kula land, Makai by Pu's land.

Claimant has also some Kula land planted with Wauke. It is distinct from the Kalo patch. His House site is distinct from his land and is not enclosed. He derived the land from his ancestors who held it from the time of Kamehameha 1st.

The Agent of the King claimed one half of the Kalo patch on the ground of its having been made a poalima by the Konohik in 1847, but no reason was assigned for his doing so. The land belonged to the Hoainas from ancient times. (v. 11/354)

3043 Kapuoho (from pg. 371)

Kamakai sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 5 Kalo patches in two pieces.

1st piece of 3 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a stream, Mauka and Punaluu side by the Kula land, Makai by Namakauhau's.

2nd patch is bounded on Kaneohe side by Pookakau's land, Mauka by Newa's land, Punaluu side by a pali, Makai by Maliu's land.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land, planted with Potatoes and Wauke in spots (one acre). His House lot is distinct from his land, it is not enclosed. He has held the land over 15 years.

The King's Land Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/356)

5601 Kau

Ilikahonua sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kualoa. It consists of 4 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe side by Pupuka's land, Mauka by Kula land, Punaluu side by the road, Makai by Nawahinekaunu's land.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Potatoes, Melons etc. It may amount to half an acre or more. He has held the land for a long time, witness does not know how long.

Claimants House site is distinct from his land and is not enclosed.

The King's Land Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/357)

3064 Kaulahea

Maluihi sworn, says she knows the land of claimant in Hakipuu. It consists of 4 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe side by a stream, Mauka and Makai side by Kapuoho's land, Punaluu side by Kula land.

Claimants House site is distinct from his land and is not enclosed. It is in Kualoa. He has held the Kalo land for over ten years.

The Konohiki consented to this claim. (v. 11/357)

5953 Mahina (deceased)

Kaiaaiwale sworn, says Mahina died in 1848. He left children who were taken away to Kaaawa by Hulue, who takes care of them. The land then was returned to the Konohiki of Kualoa as there was none of claimants relations to go to the Poalima or to work the land. (v. 11/357)

Waiahole Oct. 30, 1850 (v. 11/358)

3067 Kukolo (deceased)

Kaiaaiwale sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kualoa. It consists of 4 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe and Makai side by the Konohiki, Mauka and Punaluu side by a pali.

Claimant has several cultivated spots of Kula land planted with Potatoes etc. (1 acre).

His House site is distinct from his land, it is enclosed with an adobie fence. He has held the land since the time of Kamehameha 1st.

The King's Land Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/358)

3066 Kae (deceased)

Maalea sworn, says he knows the Kalo patch of claimant in Kualoa. It is bounded on Kaneohe side by Mahiole's land, Mauka by Maalea's land, Punaluu side by the Konohiki, Makai by Kula land.

Claimant had a small piece of cultivated Kula land planted with Wauke (1/2 acre).

His House site is distinct from his land, and is not enclosed. He held the land over 10 years. Kae died in 1849, leaving his land to Wahinenui his sister. (v. 11/358)

3057 Kaiwinui (deceased)

Kaiaaiwale sworn, says the land claimed by Kaiwinui in Kualoa belongs to Kaneakalau, under whom claimant planted as a Lopa. (This was confirmed by others present and no one but Kaneakalau appeared to claim the land).(v. 11/358)

3045 Keliokahonua

Kamakai sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kualoa. It consists of a piece of cultivated Kula land planted with Potatoes and Wauke. It may contain 2 acres. It is bounded on Kaneohe side by Kapala's land, Mauka by a pali, Punaluu side by Kamakai's land, Makai by the road. Claimants House lot is Makai and is not enclosed. He derived the land from a former Konohiki.

The King's Land Agent consented to this claim, except that he objects to any more Kula land than what is cultivated. (v. 11/359)

3047 Kauaiwahine (deceased)

Kaneakalau sworn, says he knows the Kula land claimed by Kauaiwahine in Kualoa. It is partially cultivated and may contain an acre, planted with Potatoes etc. His House site is distinct from his land, and not enclosed.

Claimant derived the land from a former Konohiki. He died in 1848 leaving his land to his child Analuhi.

The King's Land Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/359)

3048 Kekihe

Kamakai sworn, says he knows the two Ilis of Kula land claimed by Kekihe in Kualoa. It is partially planted with Potatoes, Beans, Wauke etc. The cultivated portion may be an acre in extent. Claimants House site is distinct from his land, and not enclosed. He derived the land from a former Konohiki.

The King's Land Agent consented to this claim. (v. 11/359)

3011 Mahiole

Kilohi sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kualoa. It consists of 4 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded on Kaneohe side by the Konohiki (see note), Mauka by Kepaa's land, Punaluu side by Maalea's land, Makai by Kae's land. Claimant has also a piece of Kula land, planted with

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land which was recently cultivated. It may be about half an acre. His House site is distinct from his land and not enclosed.

Claimant derived the land from his ancestors who held it from the time of Kamehameha 1st. (v. 11/431)

8235 Inulama

Kahauolono sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 8 Kalo patches in 2 pieces.

1st piece of 5 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka by Kula land, Punaluu side by a stream, Makai by Kaoa's land.

2nd piece of 3 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka and Makai by Kuhia's land, Punaluu side by a stream.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Bananas, Potatoes etc. It may contain an acre. His House site is distinct from his land and not enclosed. He has held the land over 8 years. (v. 11/431)

7562 Kamai

Paikau sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It is not cultivated nor has it been attended to for two years. Claimant has lived in Honolulu since 1848. It appears that he has given up the land claimed in Waiahole. He has not house in Waiahole. (v. 11/432)

7561 Kihakauli (deceased)

Kekuenae sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Kihakauli in Waiahole. The Kalo land has not been cultivated since claimants death two years ago. (Claimants widow appeared in person and withdrew this claim, as her new husband has plenty of land besides. The land belongs to the King.)(v. 11/432)

7661 Kaukaliu

Hoopulupulu sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 5 Kalo patches in two pieces.

1st piece of 2 patches is bounded on Kaneohe and Makai side by Nahaina's land, Mauka by Kukuinui's land, Punaluu side by Naeole's land.

2nd piece of 3 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by Kukuinui's land, Mauka by Palaukai's land, Punaluu side by Piko's land, Makai by Naeole's land.

Claimants House lot adjoins the first piece of Kalo land and is not enclosed. He has held the land over ten years. (v. 11/432)

7567 Kalama

Nika sworn, says claimant gave up his land in Waiahole to the Konohiki in 1849, and went to reside at Waikiki. (v. 11/432)

Kaumaka sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 6 Kalo patches in two pieces.

Kekakeiki sworn, says that Piko gave up his land to the Konohiki previous to his death in 1848. After his death his widow declined to have anything to do with the land, saying it belonged to the Konohiki. She has married another husband with whom she lives. Her name is Kahinu. (v. 11/433)

11016 Waipio

Kamaalo sworn, says she knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 4 Kalo patches in one piece, bounded Mauka by a stream, on all other sides by a pali. Claimants House lot adjoins his Kalo land and is not enclosed. He has planted a portion of Kula land between his house and Kalo patches. He has held the land for about five years. (v. 11/434)

10228 Moo 2nd

Palaoa sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 9 Kalo patches bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka by Kainaloha's land, Punaluu side by Kuhia's land, Makai by Paikau's land.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Sugar and Bananas. It may be about half an acre. His House site adjoins his Kalo land and is not enclosed. He has held the land for seven years. (v. 11/434)

7656 Keakini (deceased)

John Kalili sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 13 Kalo patches in 3 pieces.

1st piece of 7 patches is bounded on Kaneohe and Mauka side by a stream, Punaluu side by Kainapau's land, Makai by Paikau's land.

2nd piece of one patch is bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka by Pakikau's land, Punaluu side by a watercourse, Makai by Moo's land.

3rd piece of 5 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki, Punaluu side by a stream.

Claimants House lot adjoins the Kalo patches and is not enclosed. He held the land from the time of Kamehameha 1st. He died about six months ago. Kaumuloa his daughter is his heir. (v. 11/435)

7559 Kamaua

Kahauolono sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 16 Kalo patches in 2 pieces.

1st piece of 9 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a stream, Mauka and Punaluu side by a pali, Makai by the Konohiki.

2nd piece of 7 patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka by the Konohiki, Punaluu side by a stream, Makai by claimants Kula land.

Claimant has also a piece of cultivated Kula land adjoining his Kalo land, it may be half an acre.

2nd piece of 2 patches is bounded on Kaneohe and Punaluu side by a pali, Mauka by Naahu's land, Makai by Kulani's land.

Kakeiki sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 5 Kalo patches bounded on Kaneohe side by a pali, Mauka and Makai side by the Konohiki, Punaluu side by a stream.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Potatoes, etc. It may contain $\frac{3}{4}$ of an acre. His House site is included in this Kula land and is not enclosed. John Kalili sworn, says this land has not been cultivated for 2 years. Claimant died in 1849. He left a daughter who is married but her husband does not cultivate this land. (The King's Land Agent claims this land.)(v. 11/439)

10435 Naahu

Kuiki sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 6 Kalo patches in 2 pieces.

1st piece 4 patches is bounded on Kaneohe and Punaluu side by a stream, Mauka by Kamaua's land, Makai by claimants Kula land.

Johnb Kalili sworn, says Haupu died in 1848. Since then all his relatives have died also. (No one appeared to represent the claim. It is in Govt. land.)(v. 11/441)

John Kalili sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Waiahole. It consists of 16 Kalo patches, all cultivated, in 2 pieces.

1st piece of ten patches is bounded on Kaneohe and Mauka side by a pali, Punaluu side by a stream, Makai by Inulama's land.

2nd piece of six patches is bounded on Kaneohe side by a stream, on all other sides by the Konohiki.

Claimant has also a piece of Kula land planted with Melons. It adjoins the second piece of Kalo land. It may contain half an acre. His House lot adjoins the first piece of Kalo land and is not enclosed. Claimant derived the land from his ancestors who held it from the time of Kamehameha 1st. (v. 11/441)

Koenakalima sworn, says she knows the Kalo patches claimed by Hii in Paalaa, and disputed by the Konohiki. Kapuni my husband, was Konohiki of Paalaa twenty years ago and up to about six years ago. Wahineluna held these patches before my husband and there has not been any Poalima labor done on any of those patches during my residence here. The Poalima patches of "Paalaa" are in another place entirely. The patches in dispute may have been Poalimas a very long time ago, but certainly not within 20 years past. Hii got the land more than ten years ago, and has occupied it most of the time. He went to Honolulu in 1849 and came back recently. (Claimant says Halali had charge of this land during his absence to Honolulu.)

Claimant paid for his Poalima labor days during the time my husband was Konohiki. No one went to the labor days for this land after 1849 so far as I know.

Koiniho sworn, says that during the time Kapuni was Konohiki of Paalaa, the Poalima labor was never expended on any of these patches, nor at any time during my recollection and I was born here. He confirms the testimony given by last witness.

4th Kula and Lois, Inaikunu, Ili Hanauewa.

2nd is bounded Mauka na ilina Kupapau, W. Kaiaikawaha's land, Makai Pueo's House lot, K. by Konohiki's land.

Kuokoa sworn, says the above testimony is correct. (Pupaiole and the Konohiki's Agent agree that no. 1 shall be Pupaiole's and no. 5, but no. 4 is to be divided.)

No. 2 and 3 and part of no. 4 are returned to the Konohiki.

Evening. Pupaiole's land no. 4 has been divided and both he and the Konohiki's Agent are satisfied with the division. (v. 11/565-566)
